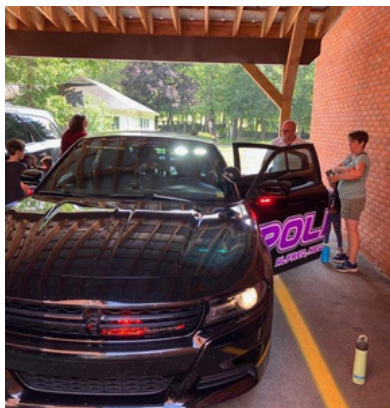


Finishing Up Summer Reading

Summer is arguably the busiest time for libraries, particularly those libraries hosting a summer reading program. Here is a highlight of summer reading this year:

- 82 people registered. (That's 50 children, 26 adults, and 6 teens).
- We hosted 27 programs between June 26 and August 21.
- Programs were attended by over 350 people!
- Participants read over 1,350 books!



Community Scarecrow Contest

Beginning September 1 you can pick up an entry form for our first ever community scarecrow contest.

How does it work? Enter to create a scarecrow. You can enter as a family, and individual, a group of friends, a business, a club or organization. Entries are accepted until September 22.

Place your scarecrows on the library lawn on the posts provided between September 27 and September 29 between 12:00pm-5:00pm.

Judging will take place and winners will be determined October 21 during FestiFall!

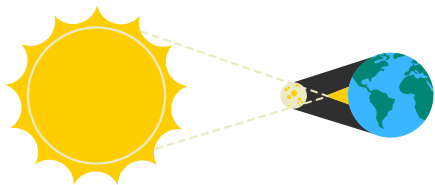
